



## City Council Meeting Minutes June 7, 2021

Roll call indicated a quorum was present.

**Richard Snuggs made a motion to approve the minutes from the April meeting, Ty Kelso seconded. Motion passed 5-0.**

### *Approve Tim Carter for a Position on the Planning Commission*

**A spot has been open on the Planning Commission for a couple of months after the resignation of one member. Mayor Hartwick stated that Tim Carter is willing to fill the position. Matt Reynolds made a motion to approve Tim Carter for the open position. Mark Hardin seconded the motion and all voted in favor.**

### *Master Agreement for Garver*

**After the passing of Ronnie Hall, the City has been in search of a firm to help with the engineering needs of the City. City officials have met with several companies regarding the position, and the Garver Corporation is willing to help with the City's needs. Many of the engineers for Garver are locally based and willing to help with local projects. The Mayor stated that they have a master agreement pending that includes water, sewer, streets, drainage, and planning services for Greenbrier. Mark Hardin made a motion to approve the master agreement for professional services with Garver. Matt Reynolds seconded the motion and all voted in favor.**

### *RAMCO Trash Services*

**July 1<sup>st</sup> will be the beginning of the new trash contract with RAMCO. A representative from RAMCO stated that commercial dumpsters have already begun to be delivered, and residential bins are being delivered from June 14<sup>th</sup> to the 16<sup>th</sup>.**

**They will be delivering around 4000 bins to residential houses, and are working closely with Waste Management to ensure a smooth transition.**

**The Mayor stated that the auditing firm contracted by the City has been at City Hall over the last couple of weeks to gather the information needed for the 2020 audit.**

*Chamber of Commerce*

**Dena DeValle and Ashton Pruitt presented the chamber report. There are seven new members to the chamber this month, and one new community partner – HomeBank – who is now a Bronze level partner. The Junk and Drive on 65 was a huge success, with many sponsors and 11 paid vendors. Many local businesses reported a large influx in sales due to the weekend event. The teacher breakfast expo will be coming up at the end of the summer. The chamber is also in the middle of a membership drive to introduce the chamber to more local businesses.**

**Mayor Hartwick informed the council that the Pierce building remodel is going well and he expects that the City will be able to move into it in the next month. The building will be used to house more office space, and act as a headquarters for Parks & Rec.**

**In anticipation of Greenbrier moving to a “City of the First Class”, which will require more employees and expanded roles for city employee, a part time role is needed. The Mayor stated that Ashton Pruitt will now be working part time for the City to do promotional and social media work. Dena DeValle will also be working with City employees to assist with paperwork and other roles during busy seasons.**

**A motion to adjourn was made by Richard Snuggs, seconded by Matt Reynolds, and passed unanimously.**
