Roll call indicated a quorum was present.

Matt Reynolds made a motion to approve the minutes from the October meeting, Richard Snuggs seconded. Motion passed 6-0.

Resolution #05-21 – Lease of Wall at 57 S. Broadview

The resolution was proposed to approve the terms of a lease by the city from Trinity Development for the south side exterior wall of Dollar Tree. The wall will be used for a large mural by the city. The lease is for \$1 a year for 10 years. The mural has been planned by community members and the Chamber of Commerce. A motion to approve the resolution was made by Richard Snuggs. It was seconded by Matt Reynolds and passed unanimously.

Resolution #06-21 – Acceptance of Dedication Deed by Jerry Cunningham

Mr. Jerry Cunningham, who owns the laundry mat on West Main St. offered to dedicate part of the property to the city to use as a turn between W. Main and Mountain Drive. As a part of the agreement, the city will remove the culvert that is currently there. The resolution accepts the terms of the property dedication. A motion to approve Resolution #06-21 was made by Mark Hardin, seconded by Larry Johnson, and passed 6-0.

Update on East Main Sidewalk Project

Mayor Hartwick stated that the sidewalk project is currently out to bid. A notice must run in the newspaper for two weeks. After that there will be one week for the

bid to rest, and it is expected that the bid should be ready to open and accept at the December Council Meeting. After that, work should begin.

Mayor Hartwick also stated that the 2022 City Budget should be distributed to the councilmen at the December meeting so that they can review it before the first of the year.

Chamber of Commerce – Ashton Pruitt

There are nine new members to the Chamber this month, totaling 79 new members in 2021. The month of October held several successful events including the Mix and Mingle at Harps, and the October Lunch and Learn. The Holiday Open House will be on November 17th, with 13 planned stop vendors participating in the event. Glisten in Greenbrier is coming along very well, with several substantial sponsorships and funding. The Christmas Parade will take place on December 9, and the Chamber election will take place in November.

A motion to adjourn was made by Richard Snuggs, seconded by Matt Reynolds, and passed 6-0.
