



## **City Council Meeting Minutes March 2, 2026**

**A motion to approve the minutes from the February meeting was made by Mark Hardin, seconded by Jason Bollinger, and passed unanimously.**

### *Chamber of Commerce Report – Chamber President Ashton Pruitt*

**The Chamber held several events in the month of February, including a ribbon cutting at MillCo. The Chamber of Commerce Banquet will be held on March 12 at Legacy Acres. Upcoming events include a ribbon cutting at InSync Counseling on April 4, and Farm Bureau on April 9.**

### *Parks & Recreation Report – Mike Yoder*

**Mike Yoder, the Parks & Recreation Director for the City of Greenbrier, presented the annual Parks & Rec report. Youth basketball in 2025 had 57 teams, and around 300 ball games. There were around 100 volunteer coaches that gave their time to the youth basketball program. The parking lot at the baseball complex was resurfaced over the last year, and they are currently replacing all of the light poles at the facility. Other facility improvements included remodeled bathrooms at the softball complex, and an added a softball field. There are currently 47 teams signed up for spring baseball, and 26 softball teams. In 2026, they would like to build outdoor pickleball courts in the City at the softball complex.**

*Ordinance #2026-02 – Rezone 38 Highway 25 from R-1 to R-2*

**City Attorney Dustin Chapman presented the ordinance to the council. Mr. Tim Tyler was representing the property owner. The rezone was approved unanimously at the February Planning Commission meeting with no opposition present from the community. The rezone is to allow for duplexes on the property rather than single family units. Jason Bollinger made a motion to suspend the rules and read the ordinance by title only. Mark Hardin seconded the motion and all voted in favor. After reading the heading, Jason Bollinger made a motion to approve the ordinance, Kelly Knowland seconded, and the motion passed unanimously. Larry Johnson then made a motion to approve the emergency clause, Jason Bollinger seconded, and all voted in favor.**

*Sanitation Collection Contract*

**Mayor Hartwick informed the council that the trash collection contract is coming to a close at the end of June. The City is hoping to put a new contract up to bid, and to have bids available at the April meeting. A motion to put the contract up to bid was made by Kelly Knowland, seconded by Meredith Post, and all voted in favor.**

**City Attorney Dustin Chapman stated that the fence at 122 S. Broadview is expected to come down this week. There is also a new statute from the state legislature that all municipalities pass an artificial intelligence use policy. He will be presenting an ordinance for the City of Greenbrier in the coming months.**

**A motion to adjourn into executive session was made by Richard Weaver, seconded by Mark Hardin, and all voted in favor. The council went into executive session at 6:50pm**

**The City Council exited executive session at 7:31. Their discussion surrounded staff policy issues. There was no action taken.**

**A motion to adjourn was made by Richard Weaver, seconded by Mark Hardin, and passed with no opposition.**
